
<u>Parking Lot</u> - When picking up students at the end of the day, please do not leave the parking lot until the busses start leaving the school.

The noon meal card is \$35.00, enough for 10 meals, Kindergarten-Grade 4 is \$25.00. The soup and sandwich card is \$20.00 - this covers soup, sandwich and/or biscuit. Cards can be purchased at the school office.




