ADMINISTRATOR'S MESSAGE

After a very mild March it certainly ended with a roar. Hopefully, that was the final blast of winter weather and we can look forward to more spring like conditions. With the varied weather conditions please pay close attention to ensure your children are dressed for the weather. We are seeing continued success with our reading goal. This year's focus on phonics and the science of reading is showing great promise for growth in our young readers. One strategy we are finding has great benefit, is rereading. Encourage your child to reread the same book, poem, or short story. This helps increase fluency and build confidence in their reading.

Although there is still three months remaining in this school year we are already looking and planning for next year. The first big part of planning that takes place this time of year is staffing. Raquel Olson has accepted a transfer to Shellbrook Elementary. Donna Autet has accepted a transfer to Wild Rose Elementary. Both Mrs. Autet and Mrs. Olson have been wonderful teachers here at Canwood and although we are sad to see them go we know they will be great additions to their new schools. Mrs. Willems and Mrs. Hansen are both transitioning from halftime to fulltime teaching at Canwood. Ms. Kotyk who has been filling in for Mrs. Balicki while on maternity leave has accepted a position in Debden for next year. We wish all the best for our staff who are changing schools.

Continuing the theme of school staffing it is my regret to inform our community that our staff has been reduced by one fulltime teacher position for the 2021-2022 school year. This reduction is a result of reduced student enrollment this past year. Although it is not a consolation, we are certainly not the only school facing these reductions in students and staff. Schools across the division and the province are facing similar reductions. You can help us, by informing the school if you are aware of students who would be either returning to in person schooling or are new students to the community for the 2021-2022 school year. We understand this has been a very difficult year with many hard choices, but the staff of Canwood Public school will continue to be here working hard to provide a safe, welcoming learning environment for our community. We as much as anyone look forward to the day where we can return to school not only being a place of learning but a place to gather, socialize, play and compete in athletics.
