Water Bottles - If anyone has new or gently used water bottles they would be willing to donate to the school for students to use, we would appreciate the donation.


COMMUNITY EVENTS

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Dear Parents and Guardians,

Subject: Top 4 Safety Tips for Students Around Schools

At Canwood Public School, we prioritize the safety of our students above all else. To strengthen our safety efforts, we want to share with you the top 4 safety tips that focus on "Stranger Danger," "Bullying Awareness," "Walking in Groups," and "Traffic Safety." By emphasizing these key areas, we can make our school environment even safer.

1. Stranger Danger: Remind your child that they should never talk to strangers, accept gifts, or go anywhere with someone they don't know. Teach them to recognize safe adults, such as teachers, staff, and other parents, in case they need help.

2. Bullying Awareness: Open communication is crucial. Encourage your child to talk to you or a trusted adult if they are being bullied or witness bullying. Talk to them about the importance of reporting such incidents to school staff when appropriate.

3. Walking in Groups: Encourage your child to walk to and from school with friends or in groups. There is safety in numbers, and it's less likely for incidents to occur when they are with others. Discuss with them the importance of sticking together and looking out for one another.

4. Traffic Safety: It's essential to follow traffic rules. Remind your child to use designated crosswalks, obey traffic signals, and never dash out into the street. Caution them to be alert in parking lots and around vehicles. If your child has their license, please remind them to put their cell phones away.

By focusing on these four critical areas, we are working together so that our students are better prepared to navigate their surroundings safely. We believe that a collaborative effort between parents, students, and the school community can create a secure and nurturing environment where our children can thrive.
