We also had a very successful Student Progress Conference evening. The school was filled with meaningful conversations focused on student learning, progress, goal-setting, and supports. We sincerely appreciate the many parents and caregivers who took the time to attend. Your involvement plays a vital role in your child's success, and we value these opportunities to work together.

Our upcoming Dessert Theatre continues to generate excitement, as tickets for the performance on Tuesday, March 31st at 6:30 p.m. sold out in a couple days. I would also like to share a few important updates/reminders to our school protocols, effective March 25th:

Late Arrivals: We will no longer be using late slips. Students arriving late are required to sign in on the clipboard at the office and then proceed to class, where the teacher will mark them late.

Early Dismissals: If a student needs to leave early, parents/guardians must notify the school in advance. Students must sign out on the clipboard at the office before leaving.

Emergency Lunches: These will be available between 11:44 a.m. and 12:04 p.m. Students must inform the hallway lunch supervisor if they require a lunch. When Ms. Meyers and Mrs. Tetreault are available they will distribute lunches.

Food & Drink Guidelines: Students are not permitted to bring large quantities of pop into the school or classroom unless approved by staff beforehand. Having a single drink stored in their locker is acceptable. Energy drinks are not allowed in the school, and we ask that older students do not purchase them for younger students or siblings.

We believe that well-nourished and hydrated students are better prepared to focus and succeed in their learning. To support this, we provide toast each morning, snacks and lunches when needed, and access to two water dispensers.

Thank you, as always, for your continued support in helping us create a positive, safe, and engaging environment for all students.

Over the Easter Break, our gym floors will undergo a thorough cleaning and polishing process. This maintenance is completed every 2–3 years and will restore the floors to a like-new condition.

To help preserve this gym floor, we will be implementing stricter expectations moving forward. Only clean, indoor gym shoes will be permitted in the gym at all times. Students will no longer be allowed to wear boots or any outdoor footwear in this space.

We appreciate your support in helping us maintain our facilities and keep our gym floor in excellent condition for all students to enjoy.


